


NATHEALTH and APACMED partners to advance UHC through Indian MedTech

MoU signed to harness the role of the medical technology industry in India, in relation to AB-PMJAY and to achieve UHC in India by optimizing relevant policies



The industry body, <u>NATHEALTH</u> - Healthcare Federation of India, renowned as the credible voice of the health sector of India and the <u>Asia Pacific Medical Technology Association</u> (<u>APACMed</u>), the regional association of medical technology in the Asia Pacific signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on 9 Sep 2020 to harness the role of the medical technology industry in India, in relation to <u>AB-PMJAY</u> and to ensure that it optimally engages with relevant policymakers, helping shape polices leading to achieving UHC in India.
